EYE PROTECTION

It is a mandatory requirement of the Championships that all players wear eye protectors that have met one of the National Safety Standards for Squash, available from the following Countries:

GB - BS7930:1
 USA - ASTM F803
 Canada - CSA P400
 AUS/NZ - A/NZ 4066

These eye protectors must always be worn properly over the eyes when on court. It is the responsibility of the player to ensure that their eye protector complies with the Regulation. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

ANTI DOPING

• By entering the Tournament, you agree to abide by the Rules and Regulations governing the Championship and declare that you are aware of the Anti-Doping regulations and procedures as set out in Section E and Appendix G of the WSF World Championship Regulations. You accept that you may be dope tested under these regulations at any stage of the Championship and will be subject to the penalties set out in the World Championship Regulations if the test(s) prove positive. This declaration also covers participation in Plate events as applicable to this Championship.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- All competitors denote their agreement to abide by the England Squash Code of Conduct.
 Parents must refrain from interference in matches. Any complaints should be addressed formally to the tournament desk.

PLAYER WITHDRAWAL

- Tournament Specific
- In the event of a withdrawal prior to the closing date, a full refund of tournament entry fees will be given less any administrative fees incurred.
- In the event of a withdrawal within 2 weeks post the closing date, 50% refund of tournament entry fees will be given less any administrative fees incurred.
- In the event of a withdrawal later than 2 weeks post the closing date, no refunds will be given.
- General
- Withdrawal from the tournament after it has started must be notified to the Event Director as soon as possible in person or by email with a valid reason.
- The reason for withdrawal should then be confirmed within 7 days and in the event of illness or injury, should be accompanied by a letter of explanation from a parent or coach or a medical certificate.

Failure to do so will result in zero points being award for the event in the ranking process.

<u>Please Note: England Squash will not be responsible for any refunds other than entry fees.</u>















TOURNAMENT FORMAT

GENERAL

- All categories will be played out on a full Monrad basis to final places.
- All categories are maximum 64 draw. Where draws are below 64 players may only have 2 or 3 matches this is unavoidable
- All players are required to play all scheduled matches –failure to do so without good reason may result in disciplinary action.
- All matches are best of 5 games PAR (point a rally) to 11.
- If the score reaches 10 all a player must win by 2 points.
- Injury /illness during the event must be reported to the Tournament Desk asap.
- Basic First Aid will be available at the Tournament Desk

SEEDING

• England Squash have completed seedings using the seeding panel process this can be found online.

PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILMING

- Recording of matches for coaching / performance analysis purposes is acceptable provided both players and / or their parents / coaches have agreed.
- People wishing to film/take photographs should notify the Tournament Desk and complete the appropriate form.















TOURNAMENT REFEREES STATEMENT

All players must be prepared to assist with the marking and / or refereeing of matches if required.

Players will be notified in advance if this is required.

It has been agreed that players should receive a statement before any major event setting out the stance to be taken by the appointed referees as regards to discipline.

The Tournament Referee would therefore like to make the following statement at the beginning of these Championships to set this stance on matters regarding behaviour and discipline.

Approved eye protection must be worn at all times including the knock-up and practice.

The referees will be working on the following guidelines:

Any form of obscenity whether audible, mouthed or gestured will receive no warning and a penalty of one point or game will be given. The referees line of 'no easy lets', i.e. where there is minimal interference and 'no cheap strokes' will be followed. Hopefully this will ensure flowing matches with the minimum of stoppages.

Players and coaches are advised to make themselves familiar with the current Code of Conduct and the automatic penalties for accumulated points. We will implement the Code of Conduct rigorously, i.e. any breach of Rule 15. (Audible and visible obscenity, verbal and physical abuse, dissent, coaching, late back on court)

Throwing of rackets and smashing them comes under the above. At the first sign of racket abuse the referee will use the code of conduct according to the severity of the offence

Whilst referees will be doing their utmost to get all decisions correct there will inevitably be times when the players disagree. In such circumstances please refrain from any antagonistic comments. It would be appreciated if you could simply ask for an explanation which will be given. Dissent towards referees will be penalised.

Referees will apply normal code of conduct as soon as they consider that a discussion is being unnecessarily prolonged. This does not mean that an amusing quip or comment even if mildly directed towards the referee will be regarded as a code of conduct offence.

Referees at this event are sometimes disadvantaged by having to officiate from a position well behind the courts and below the ideal height. This reduces their ability to determine whether pick-ups are good or not at the front of the court. The referees would greatly appreciate players honesty in declaring promptly if their shots are 'not up', 'down' etc. Should you wish to talk to the referee, please move onto the 'T' which enables your voice (and the referees) to be heard over the glass back wall. You may also move to the doorway and speak from there but, please do not leave the court.















The Tournament Referee and Assistant Tournament Referee will be present at both clubs for the duration of the Championships and will be happy to discuss or give further information.

Please follow these guidelines and hopefully we will have an event free from controversy,
