Key responsibilities:

- Providing coach education through the delivery of the England Squash Participation and Club Coach Awards both online and in-person.
- Providing ongoing coach development through the delivery of an agreed local programme of Continuous Coach Development courses, always striving to accelerate the learning of coaches.
- Planning and evaluating coach development sessions to optimise learning.
- Acting as an ambassador for, and promoting the best interests of England Squash, including the promotion of our culture and core values.

To excel in this role, you'll need to:

- Be an effective communicator able to confidently deliver clear written and verbal messages to individuals and groups alike.
- Have the ability to work independently and with high levels of autonomy.
- Possess proven time management and prioritisation skills.
- Be self-aware; you'll constantly be striving to develop professionally and personally.

- Be committed to actively contributing and building an inclusive culture in your role and day to day behaviours.
- Be flexible to deliver courses on evenings and at weekends.
