



Rebound Club Collection Guide

A great way to get involved with our Rebound Program is to set up a collection bin at your club. Here are some suggested steps to follow:

1. Register to become a collection point:

Fill out our form to let us know your club would like to set up a collection bin. Let us know if you'd like this to be a publicly accessible donation bin, or for your club members only.

2. Set Up Your Donation Bin:

Any cheap bin will do, but we also offer branded collection bins suitable for indoor placement which can be sent to you. If you

would like to purchase a branded bin, email

foundation@psasquashtour.com to request one. The cost is £20.

3. Set Up the Bin

Once you have your bin, we recommend placing the bin behind your club's reception in case any valuable items are donated.

4. Promote the Initiative

Share the donation drive with your members through your club's newsletter, social media, and notice boards.

5. Fundraise for Shipping Fees

A great method to cover the fees for posting your donations to us, is to place a collection tin left at reception where members can donate loose change over the year to help cover these costs. For example, a 20kg large box can cost around £20 to post nationally to our office in Leeds, UK.

6. Post Your Donations

Once you feel you have enough donations to fit into a large box, let us know. You can either post your donations to our office in Leeds (UK), or ship the donations directly to one of our Squash for Development beneficiaries.

Example Email to Notify Club Members

Dear members,

We have set up a donation point at the club accepting any usable but unwanted squash rackets, sports clothing, court shoes and balls through the Squash United Foundation's Rebound initiative. All donations are passed on to charity Squash for Development organisations across the world that work with children from underserved communities. You can find out more about their initiative here:

Please post your donations to our office in Leeds (UK). We then ship all donations internationally to our partner Squash for Development organisations. Our postal address is:

Frequently Asked Questions

What do I ship the donations in?

This will require you to purchase / source a suitably sized cardboard box to send the collected items in. Squash rackets are roughly 70cm long, so the box will need to be fairly large.

What courier service do I use to post the donations?

We recommend using a courier comparison service that will show you the cheapest options available to you. For example:

How are the funds covered to post the donations to the Squash United Foundation?

Usually the club hosting the collection cover the fees to post the donations to our office in Leeds (UK). For a large box around 20kg in weight, this may be around £20 if shipping domestically. We recommend setting up a collection tin at your club reception for loose change donations to help cover this cost. The Squash United Foundation may be able to help fund shipping costs to our office if the club is struggling to cover this.

Can our club retain the donations for our own use?

When you register your collection point, there will be a section to explain if you would like to do a Rebound collection for your own programmes. Use this section to explain what programmes your club / facility run that you would like to use the donations for. Acceptable causes include introducing local schools to squash, refugee programmes, sessions for populations with mental, emotional or physical disabilities, or programmes that work with children from low-income families. A club / facility cannot retain the donations for their general junior squash sessions.

Should we send our collection of equipment to your office in Leeds (UK), or directly to one of the beneficiaries?

This is at your discretion and will likely be decided by where is cheapest to ship the donations. If you are based in the UK, it will be cheaper for you to post the donations to our office in Leeds. You may feel more passionate about a particular Squash for Development Organisation, in which case you may ship the donations directly to them. If you are accepting Rebound collections outside of the UK, it may be cheaper to ship your donations directly to a Squash for Development Organisation. Please email foundation@psasquashtour.com if you would like to ship your donations directly to a beneficiary, we can pass on the relevant details.
